#### RESPONSIBILITIES

#### Okaloosa County Airports

- Operate and maintain the **network** of County Airports in a safe an efficient manner
  - Provide for general aviation (GA) access and business activities at GA airports (DTS & CEW)
- Abide by all local, state, and federal guidelines concerning operations & development within airport boundaries

#### Airport Manager

- Ensure all tenants and the public have necessary infrastructure and support required by law or agreements
- Enforce standards including County ordinances and FDOT, FDEP, EPA, FAA, etc. rules and grant assurances
- Ensure safety & mitigate hazards within airport boundary (wildlife, perimeter security, airfield operations, etc.)
- Single point of contact through the County to address any topics with outside agencies or the Public




#### RESPONSIBILITIES

#### • Tower / FAA / FSDO

- Ensure airspace is safe
- Safety & control of aircraft landing, taking off, and transiting assigned
- Enforce regulations regarding ground movements inside the controlled movement areas
- Can develop and enforce pilot approach and departure procedures
- Notification and approval or complaints relative to airspace compliance

#### Fixed Base Operators

- Uphold responsibilities per agreements with Okaloosa County
- Meet minimum standards to provide services such as fuel, maintenance, flight school, catering, exceptional customer service, etc.
- Assist with field operations / represent the County when staff not available for immediate response





## CHANGES ON THE AIRFIELD

- Changed from uncontrolled to controlled November 1,2017
- Active management on the field Chad Rogers & Erika Enrico
- Airfield Drivers License now required to operate vehicles on AOA (inside the fence)
- Speed bumps and speed limit signs on north access road
  - 25mph—Tickets will be issued
- Card change over June 4th
- Security expectations if you see something, say something

#### 6.3.9.1. Vehicle Gates

At vehicle access gates, the chief concern is tailgating, especially at unstaffed vehicle access points. Tailgating involves an unauthorized vehicle closely following behind an authorized vehicle in order to pass through an access point before the gate closes. The gate and signage should be designed to allow practical and efficient use of the gate by authorized users and to prevent tailgating in a safe and non-confrontational manner. It is the responsibility of each authorized person to prevent tailgating; and where prevention is not practical or safe, to report suspected unauthorized access. Signage should remind vehicle operators to confirm gate closure.



#### GATE KEYS FOR COUNTY GATES TO GA HANGARS

- Keys / gate codes will change over June 4th
- Each hangar / leasehold will initially receive two keys
- Drivers License will be valid for a year from issue date
  - Refresher course will be on the website to take before
    DL is expired—Reminders will be sent
- Evaluating process for issuing additional keys in updated rules and standards
- Will require documentation for access, airfield driver training, and processing fee





## COMMON ISSUES ON THE FIELD

- Waiting for the gate to close behind (adjusted timing to alleviate excessive wait)
- Cannot operate business on the airfield without an Airport and Board County of Commissioners approved agreement
- Parking in non-designated areas; approved areas are in/by hangar while aircraft out
- Cannot park aircraft in taxi lanes or in between hangars, you can only park aircraft on aprons or inside hangars
- No exercising, riding bikes or unlicensed vehicles on the airfield—transport to/from hangar only
- Be a good neighbor to the other hangar owners

## HANGAR INSPECTION ITEMS

- Hangar Inspections (Annual)
  - Tentative time frame / April June 2019 / Notification letters will be distributed 30-days in advance
  - Destin Fire Inspector will accompany GA Manager &/or Ops Coordinator
  - New FAA Policy / June 2016

Storage of items in hangars: Simply requires that storage of non-aviation items in a hangar not interfere with movement of aircraft in or out of the hangar, or impede access to other aeronautical contents of the hangar


